## Robotics Summer Camp at IIITDM Kanchipuram

I am delighted to submit this report on my experience at the Robotics Summer Camp held at IIITDM Kanchipuram from 5th May 2025 to 9th May 2025. This camp provided a valuable opportunity for me to acquire knowledge and skills in robotics. The camp commenced with a comprehensive introduction to robotics, where we were taught the mechanisms of common machines such as paper cutters, scissors, and wipers using linkage software. This theoretical foundation prepared us for the practical sessions that followed. Over the next two days, We worked in teams to build and assemble various robotic projects. On the second day, we were given on of the robotic kit using which we created an "Object Follower Robot." On the third day, we worked on our second project, the "Scorpion Bot," and also received a motivational speech that was highly beneficial. On the fourth day, we had the opportunity to visit the IIITDM labs, where we observed the makerspace, editing room, and working models of drones, 3D machines, and a car, all made by the students of IIITDM. We also attended a lecture on the evolution of technology, which was insightful and informative. The camp concluded with a comprehensive test on the concepts learned, followed by the organization of the valedictory function which was conducted by the students who participated . I had the privilege of hosting the event along with my co-host and was honored to receive the certificate of participation, special appreciation, and Best Performer award. There were totally 6 schools participating including our school. And 2 of our students, myself and Pratheesh M got the best Performer award. I am feeling happy and proud after attending this camp, as I have learned a lot of things, from the basics of robotics to building and assembling robotic projects. This experience has not only enhanced my technical skills but also taught me the importance of teamwork and problem-solving.
