Education even from far away...

TINU JACOB – ENGLISH FACULTY

Education is an important part of everyone's lives; it will either make them or break them in the future depending on the careers they choose. Education is greatly different today in comparison to earlier days because of advancements in teaching and other great inventions that provide easier techniques of teaching.



I, Tinu Jacob a faculty of LWA, want to narrate my experience with online teaching. Today, to prevent the spread of Covid19, many schools, as well as colleges, are conducting online classes. Being a teacher, I feel happy to teach online, it's because I have gathered an adequate amount of information about technologies that I was unaware of, but sometimes I miss my students and my live interactive sessions as well.

Lightworkers Academy, Chennai reopens every year on the first week of April, but this year due to the pandemic our school remained closed. Not only mine, all over the world it was in dire straits. It was totally a new experience with online teaching too. June 4 2020, I had my first experience in Online Teaching. I invited my students for video conferencing via the ZOOM app and had my first class. I was naive of many options that were visible on the Zoom app but later mastered it all.

I call my students thrice a week and teach them my subject. I see my students who are seated on their chairs, sofa, or even bed. After conducting online classes I assign the students some work in Google Classroom, even provide worksheets and activities for every week. Then I evaluate each child and give them a star mark on the work the child has uploaded in Google Classroom. Online teaching benefited in many ways as it helped ensure self-learning from the child's end, it was manageable, and students could conveniently access teachers and teaching materials. It also reduced the use of travelling resources and other expenses. It eased administrative tasks such as recording lectures and marking attendance. Both the students and teachers had an opinion that online learning modalities had encouraged studentcenteredness during this lockdown situation. The student had become self-directed learners and they had learnt at their own pace at any time of the day.

The crux of the matter in online education is that students started using more technologies that are needed in their future degrees. This can also be improved further by giving more live interactive sessions among teachers and students, homebased activities which involve parents and grandparents at home, giving seminars for the students to improve their communication skills, enabling each student to think from their point of view, and giving equal opportunities for all. Online education has both advantages and shortcomings, but it is an excellent method of learning that can help develop a student's performance.

LWA Talks is a much sought after series for our student fraternity through which we present them an arena of career opportunities that awaits them beyond the school doors. One such session was presented by Dr. Pratheepa, Professor at SRM Medical College, Hospital and Research Centre on the 27th of March 2021. The speaker gave an elaborate idea of the different courses available for the students in the medical field. She threw light on areas such as:
