After a brief wait, which seemed to be due to another school group already viewing the contents, we climbed the stairs in the main building and followed the guides to a large room. The room was similar to a classroom, with just enough seats for all of us. The guides introduced us to the exhibition and asked questions like "What are newspapers?" and "What are archives?" They then shared fascinating facts about The Hindu's history, including its publication since 1878 and its vast archives of 20 lakh photos. Next, we were led to another room filled with photos, where we saw 78 'Madras exclusive' photos selected based on the theme "Thiral-Thiran-Thaakam" or "Crowd-Strength-Impact." The photos showcased various events, including sports matches, parties, important figures like Queen Elizabeth II and Mahatma Gandhi, school events, speeches by famous people like Martin Luther King, army parades, and scenes of Marina Beach. There were also sports photos and a table with a huge book displaying articles from The Hindu's archives, highlighting the difference between the old Madras and modern-day Chennai. 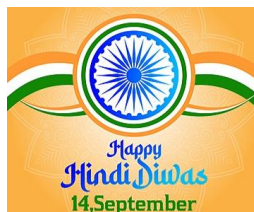

CBSE 3rd National Summit @ Crescent College

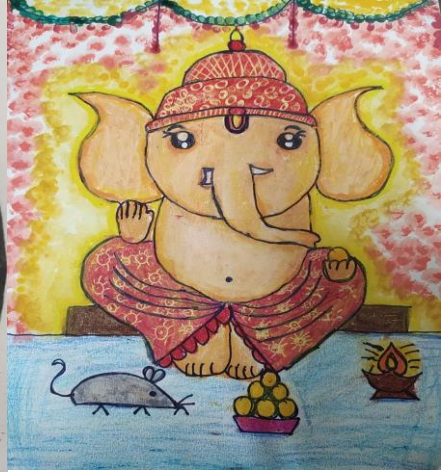

Activities

Mock Legislative Assembly – Grade 7A

Mock state legislative assembly activity was conducted. The topic of discussion were transportation in rural areas, increase in health care facility and effects of tourism on environment. The children participated enthusiastically and it was an informative activity.



Angle Sum Property of a Triangle – Grade 7

The angle sum property of a triangle is a fundamental concept in geometry that every student should grasp. To truly understand this principle, we can engage in an individual activity that brings the theory to life. Students are asked with cutting out two triangles of the same dimensions from two different colored A4 sheets. This hands-on approach not only makes learning interactive but also visually reinforces the concept. Once they have their triangles, students will measure each of the three angles at the vertices using a protractor, ensuring accuracy in their measurements. The next step is where the magic happens, students will cut out these angles and arrange them in a shape resembling a protractor. This visual representation allows them to see firsthand how all three angles combine to form exactly 180 degrees. By participating in this activity, students won't just memorize a fact; they'll experience it, making it far more likely that they will retain this critical piece of knowledge throughout their academic journey and beyond. Embracing such engaging methods solidifies understanding and fosters a deeper appreciation for geometry as a whole.



Math Lab Activity – Grade 6

The students of Class 6 actively participated in Mathematics Lab Activity to understand the operations of integers in a hands-on way.

◆ *Addition of Integers*

Students used positive and negative square discs. By combining positive and negative discs, they could clearly see how the sum is formed.

◆ *Subtraction of Integers*

For subtraction, students applied the zero pair method using discs. They created zero pairs by combining one positive and one negative disc and then removed discs as required by the problem. This activity made the concept simple.

The activity was highly engaging, and students enjoyed learning through visual and hands-on practise.



Maths Lab Activity – Grade 5

The use of fraction strips is an effective way for students to visually understand the concept of the Highest Common Factor (HCF). By physically manipulating the strips, students can see how the factors of two numbers interact and ultimately find the HCF. In this lab activity, students were divided into groups and given two numbers to work with. They used the fraction strips to subtract the smaller number from the larger number repeatedly until they reached zero. The last non-zero number they arrived at represented the HCF of the original two numbers. This hands-on approach helps cement the students' understanding of factors and the HCF in a concrete, memorable way. Rather than just memorizing formulas, they get to experience the process themselves and see the mathematical relationships at play. The activity also encourages collaboration and problem-solving within the groups. Overall, this lab activity on finding the HCF using fraction strips is a valuable learning experience that combines visual, kinesthetic, and conceptual elements to give students a deep, lasting comprehension of this important mathematics topic. For LCM, students kept two different number strips, by continuous keeping of two numbers both strips will come to a same length at one point. No of strips \times that number will determine the LCM.

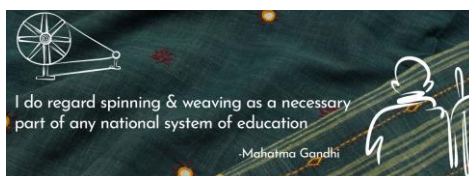


Elephant Day Activity – Class 2 & Class 3
