Class Activities

EVS Activity on Brain/Heart Model Making– Class 4

Students of grade 5 had done a group activity on model making of heart or brain as part of the EVS activity on 18/12/25. The students were divided into 8 groups with four members in each group. They brought the materials needed for the model making like clay, A4 size sheet, cardboard, writing/ coloring materials. They made the model of brain/heart using clay and stuck it on the cardboard sheet. This activity helped them to visualize the shape of the internal organs and compare their relative sizes. This activity enables them to know more about the parts of the particular organ, their functions and the location of each part in the brain/heart. This activity helps to improve the psycho-motor skills of the students also helps in developing their kinesthetic power. This group activity enhances the students to coordinate with their teammates, understand their strengths and weaknesses while working within the group. The students had a wonderful time and thoroughly enjoyed this fun filled and effective learning experience..

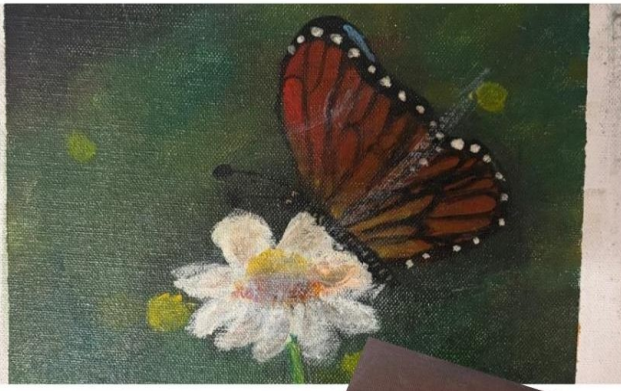
