### **Educational Field Trip**

Objective of the Trip: Classes 6 to 8 were taken to an educational trip to the Ripon Building on 14/06/2025. The primary aim of the educational trip was to provide students with hands-on learning and real-world exposure to history, architecture, governance, and culture, enhancing their classroom knowledge through visual and experiential means. Places Ripon Building (Chennai Corporation Headquarters) The Visited: 1. students were taken on a guided tour of the Ripon Building, a fine example of Neoclassical architecture, built in 1913. They learned about local governance, the role of the Greater Chennai Corporation, and the history behind the structure, named after Lord Ripon, the father of local self-government in India. The students were fascinated by the clock tower, colonial pillars, and marble interiors. The staff provided a brief session on the administrative functioning of the municipal corporation, helping students connect civics lessons with real-life operations. 2. Egmore Government Museum The next stop was the Egmore Museum, also known as the Government Museum, Chennai – one of the oldest museums in India. Students explored various sections, including: Archaeology: Ancient South Indian artifacts and sculptures. Art Gallery: Bronze statues from the Chola period. Natural History: Fossils, taxidermy animals, and dinosaur models. Children's Museum: Interactive exhibits, 3D models, and science displays tailored for young learners. The educational trip was a great success, blending fun and learning in a memorable way. It sparked interest among students to explore history, governance, and science beyond textbooks. 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


# LWA and VIT promote Inclusiveness

### Role Play On Secularism – Social Science Class Activity

To help students understand the meaning, importance, and application of secularism in Indian democracy through interactive and thought-provoking activities. The students of class 8 performed a Role play on the topic SECULARISM in NDIAN DEMOCRACY. The class was divided into small groups. Each group was assigned a real-life scenario where the idea of secularism could be applied. These included situations like: No religious festivals are celebrated in the Government run Institutions. The Religious Right of the person is not taken away by the Government. The government will intervene in the religious matters when there exists discrimination based on Religion. The activity was highly engaging. Students responded with maturity and insight. The role-play helped them connect textbook concepts to real-life issues, encouraging critical thinking and discussion about fairness and religious freedom in daily life.



### Class Activity On Constitution Assassination Day – Social Science

On the occasion of Constitution Assassination Day, our school organized a special program to educate students about the significance of this day and the lessons to be learned from India's Emergency period (1975-1977), which is widely regarded as one of the darkest chapters in the history of Indian democracy.

#### **Constitution Assassination Day**

It is observed on June 26, marking the day in 1975 when Emergency was declared in India by then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi. During this period, the democratic rights of citizens were suspended, press freedom was curbed, and thousands were arrested without trial. The Constitution, which stands as the backbone of our democratic nation, was systematically weakened- This day is remembered to reflect on how misuse of power and silencing of dissent can lead to the collapse of democratic institutions. It reminds citizens, especially the youth, to remain vigilant and uphold the spirit of the Constitution.

#### Movie Screening and Student Interaction

To help students understand this period and its impact, a short and powerful documentary was screened. The film presented real accounts and visuals from the Emergency, showing how civil liberties were taken away and how voices of the people were suppressed. After the screening, an interactive session was held. Students were encouraged to express their views on the importance of fundamental rights, freedom of speech, and the role of the Constitution in protecting democracy. Many students spoke about the need for awareness and responsibility to ensure that such a situation never repeats.


#### Outcome

Observing Constitution Assassination Day served as a powerful reminder of the fragility of freedom when constitutional checks are ignored.
