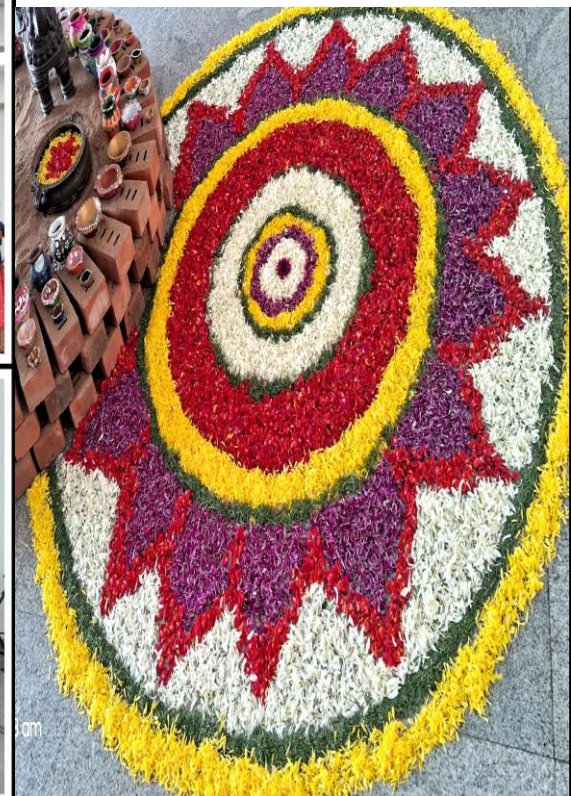

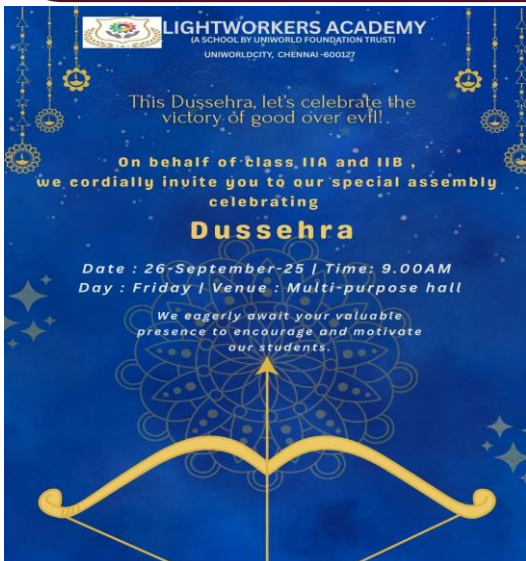
The celebration truly embodied the spirit of reverence towards the Gurus—illuminating the hearts of all present with the light of gratitude and knowledge.

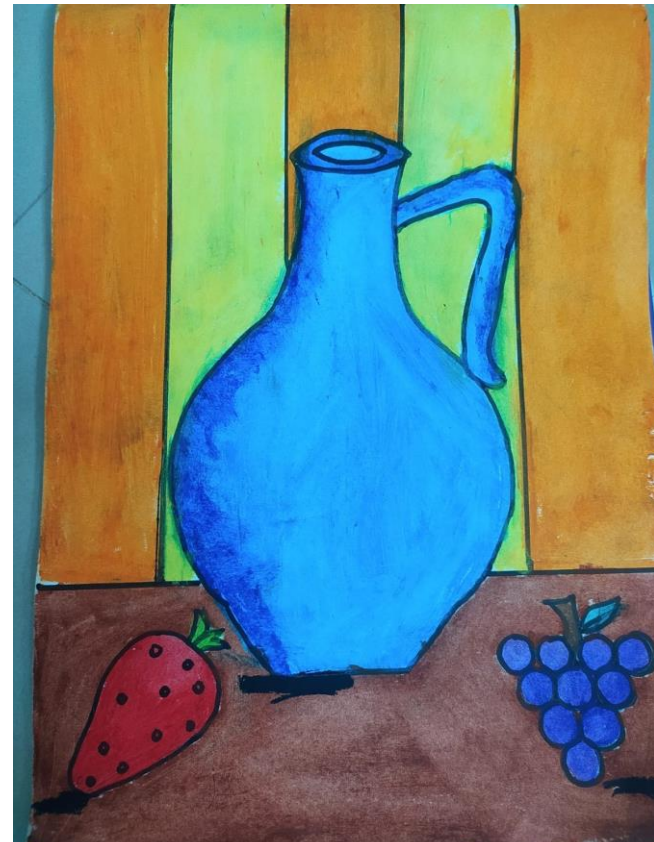

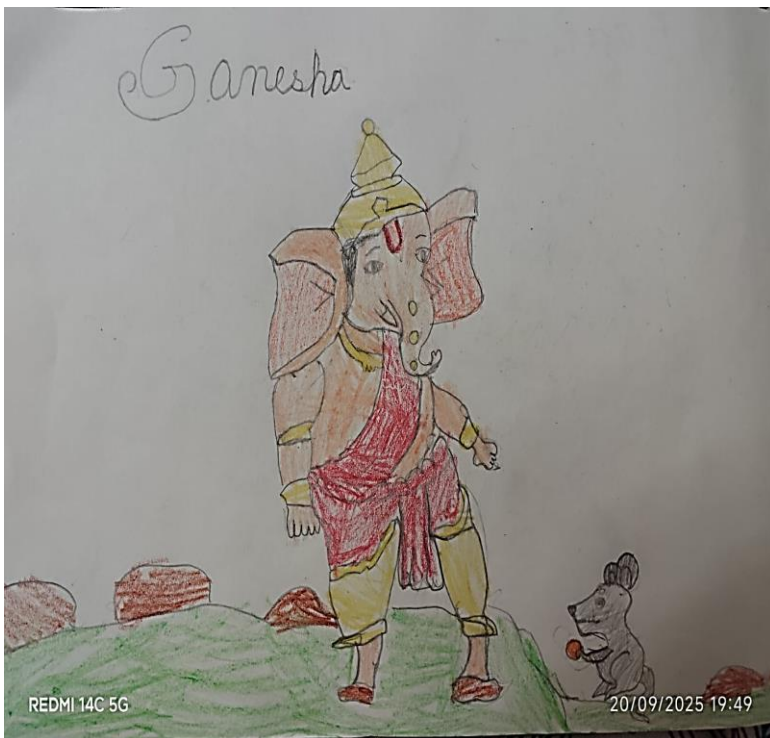
